




## **Context of Inquiry**



- Surfacing and interrogating health promotion practice and its impacts
  - Healthy Together Victoria
    - Victorian Department of Health
    - 90 + practitioners
    - 14 local government areas partnered with Community Health
  - Be Active program
    - VicHealth and Sport and Recreation Victoria
    - 5 Local Government Areas
    - Strengthen the physical activity and volunteering systems
- Early observations of 'systems' practice challenged convention

#### The turn to complexity



Need to understand and describe:


- The 'dynamic' nature of program implementation
- Programs as 'events in systems'
- A system that is highly interconnected
- By practitioners that are systems thinkers



#### Rhizome: what is it?



- A root system that contains
  - Buds
  - roots
  - Leaves
  - Nodes
- Creates new root systems
- Examples: ginger, iris, lily



## Rhizome: metaphorical application



- Applied to illuminate
  - How the WWW has created a 'dynamic reorganisation of culture' not just a set of techniques or technical platforms (Tredinnick 2013)
  - The importance of the connections between in school and out of school learning (Schuh and Cunningham 2004)

## The Wild Terrain of Systems Practice



 Rhizome invites us to follow practice rather than program through contexts

- Example
  - Adaptation
    - Encouraging / supporting adaptive behavior
  - Prtnerships
    - Expanding networks, connecting others and exerting influence

## The Wild Terrain of Systems Practice



- Rhizome metaphor opens our eyes to otherwise invisible aspects of practice
  - Neither innocent or haphazard
- But can it be
  - Propagated to spread
  - Guidedd in specific directions
  - Tamed of unintended consequences
